 - Neighborhood plan underway with SmithGroup
 - Working with city and RTA for a transit plan
 - Hosted 7 clean-ups with partners (over 90 volunteers totaling over 1000 volunteer hours)

 - Across the neighborhood, 232 trees have been planted
